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It is crucial that operating theatres are functioning at their optimum level. Not only do theatres provide critical patient interventions, but they are also responsible for a substantial proportion of both the total expenditure and income generated at every acute hospital. Evidence, including the 2016 Welsh Audit Office Findings, and NHS England 2016 data on cancelled elective operations, suggest that operating theatres could be more efficient, and safer for patients*.

“During the quarter ending 31st March 2016, 23,180 operations were cancelled at the last minute for non-clinical reasons by NHS providers. In the same period in 2014/15, there were 20,464 cancelled operations.... Some common non-clinical reasons for cancellations by the hospital include: ward beds unavailable; surgeon unavailable; emergency case needing theatre; theatre list over-ran; equipment failure; admin error; anaesthetist unavailable; theatre staff unavailable; and critical care bed unavailable.... A last-minute cancellation is one that occurs on the day the patient was due to arrive, after they have arrived in hospital or on the day of their operation.” NHS England 2016

“Theatres are an expensive resource. The direct cost of operating theatre time has been calculated as £14 per theatre per minute” Welsh Audit Office 2016
