2015 FSN ANNUAL MEETING FACULTY



Dr. Gerald B. Appel is Director of Clinical Nephrology at Columbia University Medical Center at The New York-Presbyterian Hospital, New York, New York, and is a tenured Professor of Clinical Medicine at Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons. He is Chief of the

Glomerular Kidney Disease Center at Columbia U. He received his undergraduate BA from Cornell University graduating in three years with distinction in all subjects and as a member of phi beta kappa. He received his medical degree from Albert Einstein College of Medicine, Bronx, New York, in 1972., where he was elected to the medical honor society Alpha Omega Alpha. He completed his internship and residency in Internal Medicine at Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center. He then completed fellowships in Nephrology at both Columbia-Presbyterian (1975-1976) and at Yale-New Haven Medical Center, New Haven, Connecticut (1976-1978).

Dr Appel has been listed in New York Magazine as one of the “Best Doctors in New York” annually between 1992 and 2010, and is listed in “Best Doctors in America,” and also in “How to Find the Best Doctors in N.Y. Metro Area.” He is an associate editor of Clinical JASN and of Up-To-Date. Dr. Appel is a member of numerous societies and has served on the Medical Advisory Board and as the Chairman of the Research Committee of the National Kidney Foundation of New York and New Jersey and The Kidney and Urology Foundation of America, as a past president of the New York Society of Nephrology, and as Chair of the Council of Glomerulonephritis of the National Kidney Foundation of the US. He is the director of many courses including The Columbia U Internal Medicine Course in NYC, Renal Biopsy in Medical Diseases of the Kidney in NYC, and The Treatment of Glomerular Diseases at the annual American Society of Nephrology meetings. Dr Appel has authored and co-authored almost 300 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters.



Dr. Michael Casey is an Associate Professor of medicine in the Division of Nephrology, Hypertension and Renal Transplantation at the University of Florida College of Medicine. Dr. Casey attended North Carolina State University, where he earned bachelor's degrees in chemistry and

mathematics with magna cum laude honors. He attended medical school at the University of North Carolina, where he was awarded a student research grant in neurobiology and several other student honors. After medical school, he completed his internal medicine residency at California Pacific Medical Center, San Francisco, and subsequently his nephrology fellowship at Stanford University. After finishing his transplant nephrology fellowship at California Pacific Medical Center, Dr. Casey was recruited to the University of Florida in 2008 as a transplant nephrologist. In addition to being full time faculty, he also was a fellow

in the Advanced Postgraduate Program in Clinical Investigation (APPCI) and earned a master's degree in Clinical and Translational Science from the University of Florida in 2012.

Dr. Casey is a founding member of the University of Florida kidney paired donation program and currently serves as chair of the Design Optimization and Algorithm Subcommittee for the national OPTN/UNOS Kidney Paired Donation program. Also, he created and directs a first of its kind specialty care clinic called the Immune Modulation after Return to ESRD (IMARE) clinic to improve immunosuppression management after transplant failure and optimize a patient's chance for re-transplantation. His other interests include post-transplant immunosuppression and transplant outcomes research which he has presented at numerous national and international transplant conferences. He is board-certified in nephrology and is a member of the American Society of Transplantation and Florida Society of Nephrology.

Dr. Barry Freedman is the John H. Felts, III, Distinguished Professor of Internal Medicine; Chief, Section on Nephrology at Wake Forest School of Medicine. He received his B.S. from Brooklyn College, CUNY, in 1980 and his M.D. from Downstate Medical Center, SUNY, in 1984. He completed internship and residency training in internal medicine at the Eastern Virginia Graduate School of Medicine, followed by a nephrology fellowship at the Wake Forest School of Medicine from 1987-1989. He is board certified in internal medicine and nephrology.

Dr. Freedman and his research team have worked at the WFSM for the past 25 years identifying genes associated with complex kidney disease, atherosclerosis, hypertension and type 2 diabetes mellitus. His group, along with colleagues at the Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center and NIDDK first reported the apolipoprotein L1 (APOL1) gene association with a broad spectrum of non-diabetic forms of nephropathy in African Americans. He continues to explore interactions between genetic and environmental factors involved in susceptibility to kidney disease, cardiovascular disease and type 2 diabetes.



Debra Lawson, CPC is a certified professional coder and a nephrology consultant. Ms. Lawson serves on the RPA's Health Care Payment Committee. She also serves on a subcommittee that assists RPA members with nephrology coding and documentation issues. Ms. Lawson is a contributor to RPA's publication, The Renal Physicians Guide to Nephrology Practice.

She has been a seminar leader for RPA's audio conferences on CKD billing and coding, as well as a speaker at RPA's annual meeting on various topics including billing, coding and chart auditing. She brings more than 25 years of experience to her nephrology billing, coding and documentation knowledge base.



Dr. Shaun Conlon practices with the Atlanta Nephrology Associates and is an Emory Healthcare Network Physician. He currently serves as Second Chair of the Renal Physicians Association Registry Work Group. He attended Medical School at SUNY-

Buffalo School of Medicine and Biomedical Studies in Buffalo, NY. He completed his additional training to include Internship, Residency, and Fellowship at Emory University School of Medicine in Atlanta, GA.

Dr. Glen Markowitz received his undergraduate degree from Brandeis University in 1990 and his MD from Albert Einstein College of Medicine in 1994. After three years of residency in anatomic pathology at Albert Einstein College of Medicine, he spent a year as the Renal Pathology Fellow at Columbia University in 1997-8, training under Dr. Vivette D'Agati. He subsequently joined the faculty at Columbia University, College of Physicians & Surgeons in 1998 and has remained on the faculty since that time, achieving the rank of Professor of

Pathology & Clinical Pathology in 2008 and assuming the role of Vice Chairman for Operations in 2011. During 2015, he is serving a 1-year term as the President of the Renal Pathology Society, the largest organized body of renal pathologists in the world, with a current membership that exceeds 550. Dr. Markowitz's areas of academic interest include toxic forms of renal injury, dysproteinemic renal disease, and membranous glomerulopathy. He has published more than 160 articles and many additional chapters.



Dr. David Roth is the William W. Anderson Professor of Nephrology and Medical Director of Kidney Transplantation at the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine. During his more than 30 years on the faculty at the University of Miami he has served as Chief of the Division of Nephrology and Hypertension and Training Program Director for the Nephrology Fellowship Program. In addition, he has published extensively on many clinical topics in kidney transplantation, with a particular interest in the impact of hepatitis C virus infection on

the pre and post kidney transplant patient. He is recognized as a leader in this field and in this context he Co-Chaired the KDIGO Work Group on Hepatitis C Virus in Chronic Kidney Disease and is an often invited speaker on the subject and has presented at scientific meetings both nationally and internationally. In addition to his clinical, teaching and research work at the Miller School of Medicine, Dr. Roth has also participated in the activities of the Florida Society of Nephrology, an organization for which he has served in various leadership roles.



Dr. Myles Wolf is the Director and Margaret Gray Morton Professor at the Center for Translational Metabolism and Health in the Institute for Public Health and Medicine at the Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine.

Dr. Wolf received his medical degree from the State University School of New York Downstate in Brooklyn, New York. He completed internal medicine training at the Massachusetts General Hospital and a nephrology fellowship at the Massachusetts General Hospital and the Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, Massachusetts. During his research fellowship training in nephrology, Dr. Wolf obtained a Masters of Medical Sciences in Clinical and Physiological

Investigation from Harvard Medical School, also in Boston.

During the past decade, Dr. Wolf's research on mineral metabolism has been supported by grants from the American Heart Association, the National Kidney Foundation, the American Society of Nephrology, and the National Institutes of Health. He has served as primary research mentor for students, residents, fellows and faculty members involved in patient-oriented research. He serves on the editorial boards for *Journal of the American Society of Nephrology*, *Clinical Journal of the American Society of Nephrology* and *Seminars in Nephrology*, and as an ad hoc peer reviewer for several other journals.
