- The selected abstracts will be published as supplement of the "Indian Journal of Orthopaedics."

Guidelines:

- Abstracts must be written in English.
- Please proofread your abstract for spelling and grammar before submitting it.
- Abstracts must not exceed 300 words in length.
- Do not use all upper-case letters when entering your abstract.
- The abstracts title or authors' names/institutions must not be inserted in the 'Content' field below it would be considered as unfair-means and may be rejected on that ground.
- No graphs, tables, photographs, or slide presentations are accepted. In exceptional case Photograph in jpeg can be uploaded.
- Abstracts will be published as one paragraph, so do not break your abstract into multiple paragraphs. If you wish to use headings within your abstract such as Introduction, Methods, Results, etc., they should be added at the beginning of a sentence within the paragraph and a colon (:) should be inserted after each heading.
- If similar paper submitted twice first will be accepted for review.

Oral Presentations

- Each oral presentation will be of 10 Minutes duration divided into eight minutes for presentation followed by two minutes for discussion.
- The presentation must be handed over in suitable format to central projection and preview room 6 hours before the particular session.
- Use of personal laptops and memory devices will not be allowed inside the hall.

Video Presentation

- Each video presentation will be of 10 minutes duration.
- Videos should be as CD or DVD for playing on computer and LCD projector.
- Presentation should be submitted at least 24 hours before the session.

Poster Presentation

- The poster will be displayed daily (12th, 13th, 14th December 2015).
- The poster will be of 75cm X 100cm size in portrait shape.
- Poster should be fixed at allocated place by 10 am every day.
- The presenters have to be available from 12 noon to 1 pm everyday for discussion.

Important Note:

The material submitted must not have been published or presented at any national or international meeting before this one. Submission of an abstract implies that the presenting author will register for and attend the Conference at Jaipur to present the abstract either as an oral presentation or as a poster if it is accepted. The IOACON Scientific Advisory Committee reserves the right to change the topic and the form of presentation (oral-poster) of the abstract or to reject it.

The presenting author of an accepted abstract (oral and poster) must register and pay the conference registration fee by 31 August 2015 to have his/her abstract included in the Final Program. Tiger Trail (02Nights / 03Days by Road)

The Ranthambore National Park was once the hunting ground of Maharaja of Jaipur. In 1955, it was declared a game sanctuary; in 1980, it became a national park. But with the commissioning of Project Tiger in 1972, it was included in the project. With the addition of neighbouring Keladevi and Mansingh sanctuaries, the total area of the national park stands at 1,334 sq km. But the entire park - the core area is just 392 sq kms - is not open to the public. Ranthambore Park is famous for tigers and due to conservation efforts; the tiger population has stabilized if not increased here. The tigers can be spotted quite often even during the day, at their normal pursuits-- hunting and taking care of their young ones. Ranthambore is one of the best places to see these majestic predators. Ranthambore is a heritage site because of the picturesque ruins that dot the wildlife park. There are lake palaces, 'chhatris', old fortifications and a majestic 1,000-year-old fort, overlooking the park.

Same Day Ajmer - Pushkar

Located in Ajmer, Rajasthan, the Dargah of Khwaja Moinuddin Chisti is one of the most revered places not only in Rajasthan but also throughout India. Popularly known as Ajmer Sharif, the Dargah is visited by numerous devotees every year. These devotees include not only the Muslims of India but also a large number of Hindus who revere and follow the teachings of Saint Khwaja Moinuddin Hasan Chisti popularly known as Khwaja Gharib Nawaz who is considered to be the preacher of humanity among the mankind.

Pushkar is an ancient city and has seen history being made since the Ramayana period. The account of this city can be found in the 4th century writings of the Chinese traveller Fa-Hien and also in the scripts written during the era of Muslim invasions. The city is considered by Hindus to be one of the most sacred places in India and has, perhaps, the only existing temple in Asia, dedicated to Lord Brahma.
