In addition, he is a frequent speaker on a variety of substance abuse issues and has presented to numerous groups and national organizations on the topic of electronically monitoring pseudoephedrine sales.

BRETT KESSLER, DDS

Owner, Town Center Dentistry and Orthodontics | President, Colorado Prosthodontic Society | Past President, Colorado Dental Association (Denver, Colorado)

Dr. Kessler earned a BS in Biomedical Engineering from the University of Iowa and a DDS from the University of Illinois. He completed residency at Northwestern Memorial Hospital where he focused on dental management of medically compromised patients, specifically analyzing how teeth affect systemic diseases and vice versa.
