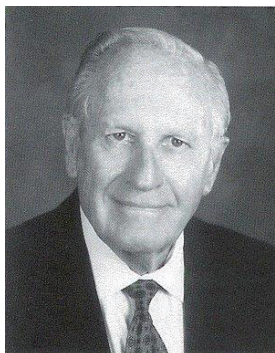

COURSE DESCRIPTION



Max R. Gaspar, M.D., was an attending surgeon at the Los Angeles County Hospital for over fifty years, and served as a Senior Vascular Attending at LAC+USC for twenty-five years. His teaching and scholarly accomplishments have had a lasting impact on vascular surgery in Southern California. This annual symposium addresses topics of interest to physicians and surgeons who care for the patient with vascular disease. The topic of the 2016 Max R. Gaspar, M.D. Symposium is “Vascular Surgery 2016.”

A distinguished faculty is assembled for the symposium, designed to update the attendee on innovation and new strategies. Sixteen didactic lectures will be given to encompass the topics of: new strategies for the treatment of cardiovascular disease, innovation in management of carotid and peripheral arterial disease, acute aortic syndromes and innovation in treatment of aortic pathology. Panel discussions are utilized to encourage audience participation. This year, we are delighted to have Dr. Rodney A. White, Chief, Vascular Surgery at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center, Professor of Surgery at the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA, as well as Medical Director, Vascular Surgery, at Long Beach Memorial Heart Institute as the Gaspar Visiting Professor. Dr. White will give his symposium address on September 8, followed by his Gaspar Lecture the following day, September 9, at the USC Health Sciences Campus.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- Identify recently developed new therapies for common cardiovascular problems.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the potential new applications of endovascular stent-graft technology.
- Outline the key management principles demonstrated by the CREST trials.
- Integrate new aortic therapies into the treatment of patients with aortic aneurysms and dissections.

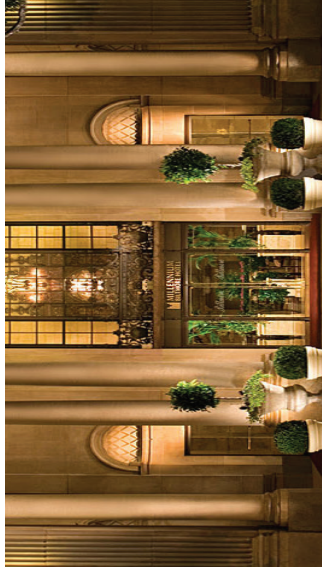
