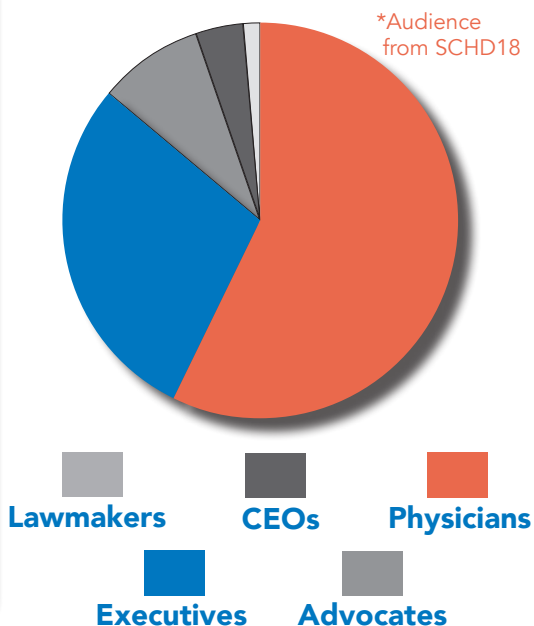
WHAT IS SCHD19?
