Overview

This program will explore research and advances in the diagnosis and management of benign hematologic conditions and hematologic malignancies including indications for novel therapies and use in special populations. Aimed at community hematologists and oncologists, as well as mid-level providers and nurses, this meeting will use case-based presentations to highlight the most recent data for management of both benign and malignant hematologic conditions. Cases will touch on recommendations for treatment of common malignant hematologic diagnoses such as myelodysplastic syndromes and multiple myeloma. We will also discuss treatment alternatives in special populations, such as the elderly patient.
