The APDS Annual Meeting (April 26 – 29, 2021) will occur in downtown Boston this spring for meetings at the Westin Copley Place. The 2021 Joint Meeting of the APDS and ARAS focuses our attention on the multiple opportunities and challenges of surgical education in the changing health care environment which provide a wealth of new opportunities and challenges.

Rahul Anand and Lisa Olson have done a terrific job in crafting creative educational components for our program. So, everyone can plan with certainty on taking part in the meeting, and all planning will be made with optimal flexibility that is possible by having all plans based on availability of BOTH in-person in Boston and live streaming capacities, e.g., all content will be available concurrently to both live audience in Boston and those using the live streaming option.

On Monday, April 26th beginning at 8:00am, the APDS will again offer the **APDS Program Directors Workshop**, spearheaded by Course Directors Drs. Ben Jarman and Albert Chahine, an optional opportunity which most Program Directors find to be an indispensable element of the APDS Annual Meeting. This program runs from 8:00am on Monday through Tuesday until 12:00pm, and brings together key materials as well as practical experience, advice, and insights, and is equally appropriate for new Program Directors as well as serving as a refresher course for experienced PDs.

The APDS program kicks off at 12:00pm on Tuesday with opening remarks from APDS President, Benjamin Jarman, MD and Rahul Anand, MD, APDS Program Chair. The afternoon begins with a paper session, followed by a panel session titled “Taking Care of the Herd: Guiding Residents Through Adversity.” The afternoon will continue with the second APDS panel session at 2:35pm and second paper session at 3:50pm, followed poster presentations from 5:10pm to 6:10pm.

Wednesday morning, APDS will begin with a paper session at 8:00am and Pro/Con Debates on Recruitment. The day continues with the APDS Presidential Address from Benjamin Jarman, MD, and a series of luncheon workshops between 12:00pm and 1:50pm. The workshops are followed by the fourth APDS paper session and third panel session, “2020. What a Year... The ‘New Normal’ for Surgical Education.” Wednesday’s program concludes with the APDS Business Meeting from 5:10pm to 6:00pm, followed by a joint reception concluding at 7:45pm.

Thursday begins with the APDS QuickShot Paper Session at 8:00am and APDS Keynote Address at 9:15am, featuring Andréa Comer, Chief of Staff of the Connecticut Paid Leave Authority. The APDS Program concludes with the popular Alphabet Soup panel, featuring Jo Buyske, MD from ABS, Ajit Sachdeva, MD from ACS, Pamela Lipsett, MD from RRC, and Donna Lamb, MBA from NRMP.

The ARAS program starts Monday morning with the **ARAS New Administrators Workshop** beginning at 7:00am. Tuesday and Wednesday’s sessions include plenty of professional development, updates from the likes of TAGME and SCORE, and a “Super-Secret ARAS Game Show” on Wednesday at 2:00pm. Wednesday will conclude with ARAS registrants participating in the Joint APDS/ARAS Reception.

Registration details are enclosed. Separate registration is needed for the APDS New Program Directors Workshop and the ARAS New Coordinators Workshop.

Be assured that APDS leadership is neither ignoring nor minimizing the impact that COVID-19 has had for all of us, nor the recent, dreadful toll the current surge is taking on both lives and the energies, talents and resources of health care professionals. But we also anticipate that 3-1/2 months hence the picture should be different. At the same time we have encountered so many profound challenges, April will mark almost two years since program directors/surgery educators have been able to meet in person and share wisdom and suggestions on ‘how we’re doing it.’ By April 26, five weeks after the onset of Spring, and after the widespread vaccination of physicians, other health care professionals and some within the general population, we expect many of our members will be able to attend the in-person meeting in Boston.
