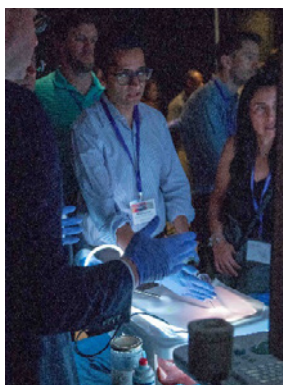
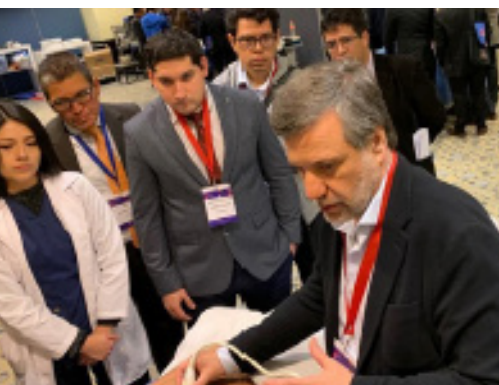
International Visas

8th Annual HPB Ultrasound and Advanced Technology Postgraduate Course

Sunday, August 1, 2021 | 7:30am - 12:00pm

Participants are strongly encouraged to complete one of the following: 1. The previously offered ACS postgraduate course "Ultrasound for Surgeons" 2. The currently offered ACS postgraduate CD-ROM course "Ultrasound for Surgeons: The Basic Course" 3rd edition

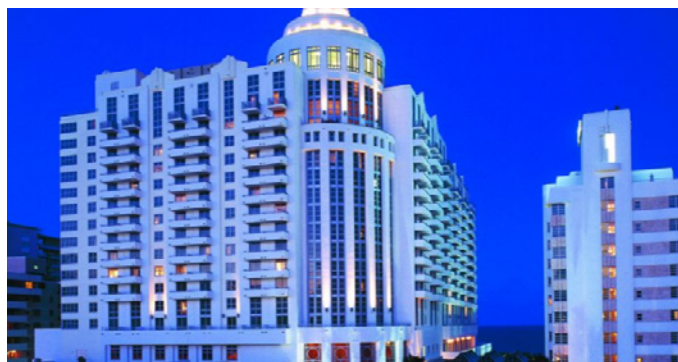
