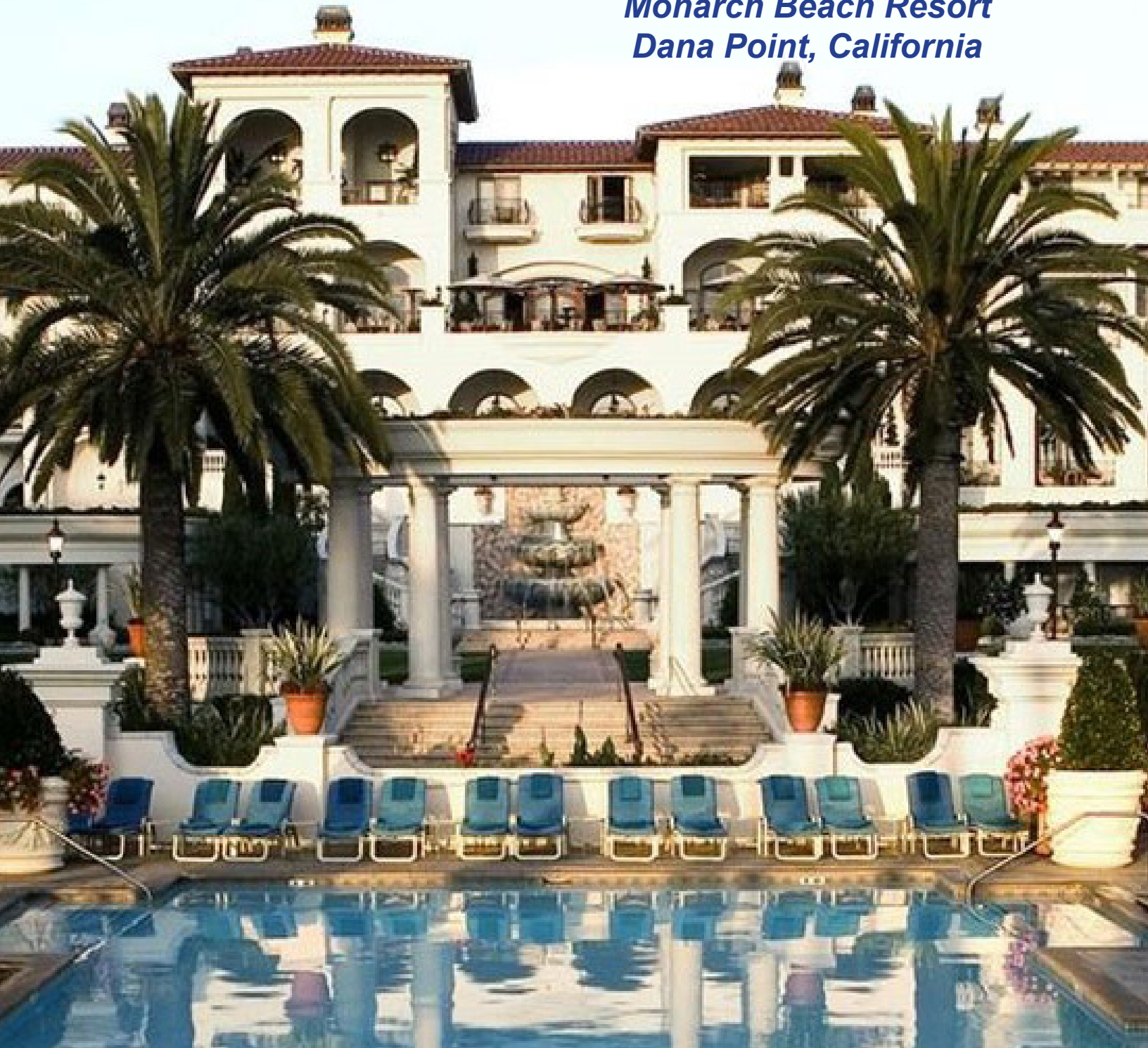

Byrd-Tilson-Walker Residents Day Presentations (4 hrs. CDE/CME)

Outstanding young oral and maxillofacial surgery residents from the Southwestern and Midwestern regions will present scientific and clinical research initiatives ongoing at their respective institutions of study.

Learning Objectives:

Upon completion of this activity, the learner will be able to:

1. Discuss a broad overview of the extensive clinical scope of oral and maxillofacial surgery residency training programs.
2. Inform oral and maxillofacial surgeons in private practice about current advances in treatment modalities, new treatment techniques and procedures, and innovative technological applications that improve patient outcomes.
3. Encourage future oral and maxillofacial surgeons to remain involved in clinical research throughout their careers and to support the expertise and evolution of the specialty.

1:00 - 5:30 pm

OMSNIC Risk Management Seminar: OMSNIC Patient Safety Concepts and Risk Mitigation Strategies for OMS (4 hrs. CDE/CME)

This two-presenter panel presentation to OMS and their staff will focus on patient safety and risk management principles that empower the OMS practice to provide safe, coordinated care. Actual cases from OMSNIC's 30-year closed malpractice claims history will illustrate key safety principles, with a special focus on clinical communication and care coordination issues. Case topics include failure to diagnose, extractions, implants and anesthesia. Attendees insured with OMSNIC will be eligible to receive a 5% risk management premium credit on their policy, applicable to the next three policy periods.

Learning Objectives:

1. Understand how anticipation of complications, planning for a response if complications arise, and communicating this information to the patient may improve patient expectations related to treatment outcomes.
2. Apply patient safety and risk management principles to improve communication and understanding amongst those in your referral network and through this coordination of care, enhance patient safety.
3. Investigate how teamwork amongst staff members, operational redundancies in day to day tasks and technology in your practice may support patient safety.
4. Analyze how timely and thorough documentation efforts assist in supporting the decisions made by providers throughout patient care.
5. Review patient safety considerations for anticipation of and planning for emergency events in an effort to improve patient outcomes.

KEYNOTE LECTURE: Technological Revolution of Dental Implants “Into the Digital Age” - A 30-Year Perspective (4 Hrs. CDE/CME)

Dental implants have become the preferred treatment modality for replacing missing teeth. Implant success, however, depends on the precision of the implant placement to effectively support prosthetic restorations. Robotic-assisted dental surgery (RADS) is a novel form of dynamic surgical guidance that, in addition to visual navigation, offers haptic guidance for implant treatment planning, osteotomy preparation, and implant placement.

Learning Objectives:

1. Discuss the history of radiography and guided robotics in dental implant surgery.
2. Describe the procedure of robotic-assisted surgery for immediate single-tooth replacement.
3. List the advantages of robotic guidance over other digital protocols.

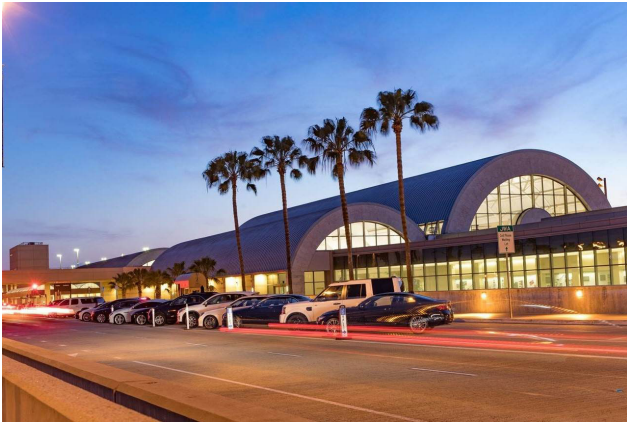

Dana Point Weather

April daytime temperatures in Dana Point are between 68°F, rarely falling below 61°F or exceeding 78°F. Evenings are cooler with temperatures around 56°F. The average surface water temperature in Dana Point is essentially constant during April, remaining within 1°F of 61°F throughout the month. Dress for the SWSOMS Combined Annual Meeting is Business Casual, exceeding 60°F.



Transportation

John Wayne Airport (JWA)

John Wayne Airport (JWA) is conveniently located just 17 miles from the Monarch Beach Resort and is serviced by most major airlines, including American Airlines, Delta, United and Southwest, with non-stop flights available through several U.S. cities.

Shuttle and Car Services

One-way shuttle services between John Wayne Airport and the Monarch Beach Resort are available from several companies and start at \$33. Lyft and Uber also serve the Orange County area.

Rental Cars and Driving Directions

Rental cars are available from the John Wayne Airport.

Driving from the John Wayne Airport: Take Airport Way toward “Return To Terminal/I-405/CA-55 N”, and keep left at the fork to continue on Airport Way. Take the 1st right onto MacArthur Blvd. and proceed for 2.5 miles. Merge onto CA-73 S (Portions toll) and proceed 9.29 miles. Take the Aliso Creek Rd exit (EXIT 4). Turn right onto Aliso Creek Rd. and go 1.96 miles, Turn right onto Alicia Pkwy. Go 1.88 miles and turn left onto Niguel Rd. Then proceed 3.72 miles to the Monarch Beach Resort.
