Course Overview

This continuing education activity has been designed with a focus on patient safety. 6. Review best practices and supporting guidelines which are the basis for policies and procedures that protect the patient.
7. Identify two communication tools to enhance patient safety.
8. Differentiate “listening” and “hearing”.
9. Identify two benefits of procedural checklists.
10. Discuss alarm management and its application to safe perioperative care.
