Welcome Message

Dear Colleagues,

I am honored to welcome you to the 71st annual meeting of the Association of University Radiologists (AUR) on April 25-28, 2023 at the J.W. Marriott in Austin, TX. The theme for the 2023 meeting is Imagine, Create, Innovate – Exploring Radiology’s Imaginarium. Many of you are probably not familiar with the concept of an imaginarium – a safe space where we can dream, imagine, be creative, problem solve, and find joy. Historically, radiology has been filled with innovation and creativity. As educators and learners, we must embrace creativity and curiosity to ensure that radiology continues to thrive. The 2023 AUR meeting promises a diverse array of highly practical and inspiring talks and experiences. The opening plenary session on **Tuesday, April 25** will address how creative thinking is critical to learning. Our keynote speaker, Mr. David Alpert, is an award-winning New York City based Broadway Director and Adjunct Professor of Acting at New York University (Steinhardt). In addition to his work directing for the stage, he is creator of E-Ticket to Broadway, a podcast that features Broadway stars sharing their love and stories of the Disney theme parks. The Vydareny Imaging Competition will take place in the late afternoon so start getting your teams ready to compete.

On **Wednesday, April 26**, the AMSER Lucy Squire and APDR-ACR Keynote lecture will focus on the power of play to solve complex problems featuring Mr. Lindsay Grace, the Knight Chair in Interactive Media and Associate Professor at the University of Miami School of Communication. Also, in the early afternoon, Mary Larkin, a Diversity and Inclusion consultant at Trinity Health, will be delivering the Robert A. Novelline Diversity and Inclusion Lecture which will focus on strategies to promote inclusive patient care.

The Brogdon panel will take place on **Thursday, April 27** and will consist of a panel discussion centered on creative communication. The panelists will be Ms. Jess Siswick, a digital artist who specializes in visual communication, storytelling, and engaging video; Dr. Stefan Tigges, a radiologist who incorporates cartoons into his teaching; and Dr. Courtney Tomblinson, a radiologist who integrates art into education.

On **Friday, April 28**, the second annual Power Pitch Plenary will feature five dynamic speakers who will present TED-style talks that should hopefully inspire us all. The plenary will then be followed by four experiential workshops –the art of peer review, the power of storytelling, coaching, and personal branding.

In parallel, the 2023 AUR meeting will surpass all expectations with its innovative and diverse arts curriculum which will highlight the amazing talent of the members of AUR, its affinity groups and affiliated societies. With a multitude of activities ranging from music, dance, visual arts, yoga, photography, nature walks, and storytelling, there is certain to be something that will appeal to everyone. In addition, breakfast roundtables will make a return on Tuesday and Thursday mornings, providing yet another opportunity for community building. And don’t forget the scientific poster sessions on Wednesday morning and Thursday afternoon, the Beer & Pretzel reception on Tuesday evening, and the Welcome Reception on Thursday evening – other ways to build your network.

The AUR Research and Education Foundation will be holding their annual fundraising event.
