The Ware-Dunn Society and the Department of Obstetrics & Gynecology are pleased to offer the **2016 Advances in Obstetrics and Gynecology Conference** in Richmond, Virginia, at The Library of Virginia.

The program has been designed for obstetrician-gynecologists in clinical practice in Virginia and nearby states; however, this conference may be valuable to family practitioners, primary care providers, and ob/gyn nurse practitioners with an interest in these topics. The two-day program will provide an intense update on minimally invasive gynecologic surgery, strategies for avoiding surgical complications, treatment of endometriosis, preservation of fertility in cancer patients, gynecological management of breast cancer patients, genetics and ob/gyn, screening for genetic disorders: preconception and prenatal options, cardiovascular disease prevention in women.
