In 2024, the European Workshop for Rheumatology Research (EWRR) celebrates its 43rd edition and will take place for the 1st time in Genova, Italy.

The EWRR is considered Europe's premier meeting for basic and translational research in the field of rheumatic and musculoskeletal diseases and is particularly aimed at attracting young scientists who are given the opportunity to present their work in an informal and interactive environment.

The EWRR has a long tradition, it was started in 1981 and still is a unique event introducing new targets, biomarkers and pathways that have always been the broad basis for the development of a modern molecular pharmacotherapy of the autoimmune and inflammatory rheumatic diseases.

The programme will contain nine major scientific sessions and two keynote lectures. In addition, State-of-the-art lectures will be given by some of Europe's most renowned researchers inside and outside the rheumatology field. Furthermore, there will be short oral presentations by young researcher of outstanding abstracts and guided poster tours.

Like in the most recent previous editions, EWRR 2024 will start with a Thursday afternoon session, and until the Saturday afternoon closing ceremony, there will be sufficient time for poster visits and discussion creating an informal atmosphere for scientific networking and social interactions.

From some decades EULAR supports the meeting with a number of bursaries and some EULAR Study Group Meetings take place prior to the European Workshop on Rheumatology Research (EWRR), but are not part of the EWRR.

Finally, also Pharma offer an unconditioned support to make possible low Workshop fees for young researches and fellows/students participation.

We are confident and enthusiastic about welcoming you to Genova to celebrate this exclusive scientific event together, and we thank from by now for their contribution all the involved colleagues and supporters.

EULAR Bursaries and Prizes

EULAR supports participation with 50 EULAR travel grants of 500 EUR each for young scientists (under 35 years of age) who have submitted an abstract as presenting author. You will be informed if you have been awarded the EULAR bursary together with your abstract acceptance notification letter.

Prizes for the best posters will be recognized during the final ceremony.

SIR Grants (reserved to younger Italian members)

The **Italian Society of Rheumatology (SIR)** has provided grants to participants selected for oral/poster presentations which have reached a high score and found to be particularly meritorious by the Referees. Only the presenter of a selected abstract will be eligible for the grant and he/she should be a SIR member, younger than 40 years old and in good standing with the membership fees (2024 included). The grant of € 1,000,00 gross will be recognized directly by SIR to the authors of selected abstracts after the congress. The winners are bound to join the conference and pay the registration fee.

The SIR grant cannot be combined to the EULAR bursary.

Abstract Submission

Abstracts can only be submitted through the Workshop website and not later than January 21st, 2024.

Abstract Notification

Once the abstract is submitted a confirmation email should be sent to the e-mail address the registered author entered in the section "Personal details".

Notification of acceptance of the abstracts will be sent by e-mail within February 5th, 2024.

The registered author will receive all correspondence concerning the abstract and is responsible for informing co-authors of the status of the abstract.

The presenting author of the accepted abstract must be registered to attend the Workshop.
