TRAVEL DIRECTIONS - LOCAL

BY CAR

If you are approaching Belfast via the M1 or M2, you should follow the signs to Belfast City Airport M3, taking the first exit for the Titanic Quarter. There are over 500 on-site, secure paid parking spaces available.

BY TRAIN

Translink operates regular train services from Belfast City Centre and beyond. Visit translink.co.uk to find out more and view up-to-date timetables. The closest station is the Titanic Quarter Station. From here there is pedestrian access via a footbridge, please then follow signage to Titanic Belfast. Walking time is approx. 15 mins from station

BY BUS

Translink operates Metro Services 26, 26A, 26B, 26C from Belfast City Centre- departing outside the Belfast Welcome Centre to Titanic Belfast. While the Airport Express 600, 600A, 600B services Belfast City Centre, Titanic Belfast and George Best Belfast City Airport.

Translink also operates the Belfast Glider which connects East and West Belfast and, Titanic Quarter with the city centre. There is a Titanic halt outside Titanic Belfast.

BY FOOT

Titanic Belfast is only 1.5 miles away from Belfast City Centre. It's a lovely 25-30 minute walk. The Official Walking Route Map is below:



The map shows two walking routes from Belfast City Centre to Titanic Belfast, following the River Lagan. Route 1 (black dotted line) is the 'City Hall Route (30mins)' and Route 2 (red dotted line) is the 'Train Station Route (20mins)'. 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TRAVEL DIRECTIONS - INTERNATIONAL

BY AIR

George Best Belfast City Airport is a short 5-10 minute drive from Titanic Belfast, with regular bus links and taxi or car hire available at the airport. For full details please see belfastcityairport.com.

Belfast International Airport is a 30-minute drive from Titanic Belfast, with a regular bus service running to Belfast City Centre - Airport Express 300/300A. Onward travel to Titanic Belfast is via bus routes detailed above. Taxi and car hire services are also available at Belfast International Airport. For full details, please see belfastairport.com.

Dublin Airport is around 90 minutes' drive from Titanic Belfast, with a regular bus service and car hire available.

BY FERRY

Titanic Belfast is easily accessible by sea with ferry crossings from both Scotland and England. Travel by state of the art superfast ferries with journey times from just 2 hours 15 minutes. Operators and travel times vary and Titanic Belfast has a close relationship with Stena Line and P&O Irish Sea who have daily crossings.

BY RAIL (FROM DUBLIN)

Irish Rail operates services from towns and cities across the Republic of Ireland to Dublin's Connolly Station, where you can then catch a connecting train to Belfast.

The Enterprise Train service (provided jointly by Translink and Irish Rail), from Dublin's Connolly Station to Lanyon Station (previously known as Belfast Central Station), runs eight times daily (five times on Sundays) and takes 2 hours 15 minutes. Book in advance at www.irishrail.ie for the best value fares.

Your Enterprise ticket includes free onward rail travel from Lanyon Station (previously known as Belfast Central Station) to Titanic Quarter Station.
