CLOSING LUNCHEON SPEAKER

Paul Pritchard - cutting-edge rock climber and mountaineer



Paul was a cutting-edge rock climber and mountaineer hailing from the UK.

His adventures took him from Wales to the Himalayas, the Karakoram to Patagonia, Baffin Island to the Pamirs and the European Alps.

On Friday the 13th of February 1998 a TV-sized boulder falling from 25 meters inflicted such terrible head injuries that doctors thought he might never walk or even speak again.

Being in hospital for a year gave Paul the impetus to write his second book: *The Totem Pole* in 2000. This narrative about his personal journey through hemiplegia also won the Boardman/Tasker prize and the Banff Mountain Book Festival Grand Prize and was translated into four languages.
