Course Description

The Hospitalist and Emergency Procedures course is the combination of an Online CME course and a one-day live CME course that is 100% hands-on procedural skills lab training. This course provides comprehensive training of the 20 most essential procedures used in the ER, ICU, and hospital wards.

The course will train students how to perform the following ultrasound-guided procedures: central line and peripheral IV placement, thoracentesis, paracentesis and arterial line placement. Also, you will learn about informed consent, procedural sedation, mechanical ventilation, intraosseous line placement, point-of-care ultrasound including spine and vascular ultrasound, E-FAST and RUSH exams, tube thoracostomy, pneumothorax evacuation, needle decompression, lumbar puncture, endotracheal intubation, video laryngoscopy intubation, intermediate airway placement and difficult airway management. Learn cardiac pathology via simulated scenario training using state-of-the-art HeartWorks TTE Mobile.

The weekend course builds on the one-day course by doubling the hands-on procedural training and solidifying the cognitive aspect of bedside procedures including knowledge of fluid analysis, complication management, and the nuances of hospital procedures in the clinical context (e.g., how to choose an induction agent for intubation, how to choose a procedural sedation regimen, review of the difficult airway management algorithm, how to manage an inadvertent central arterial line placement and other procedural complications.) Weekend students also learn cricothyroidotomy and fiberoptic intubation.

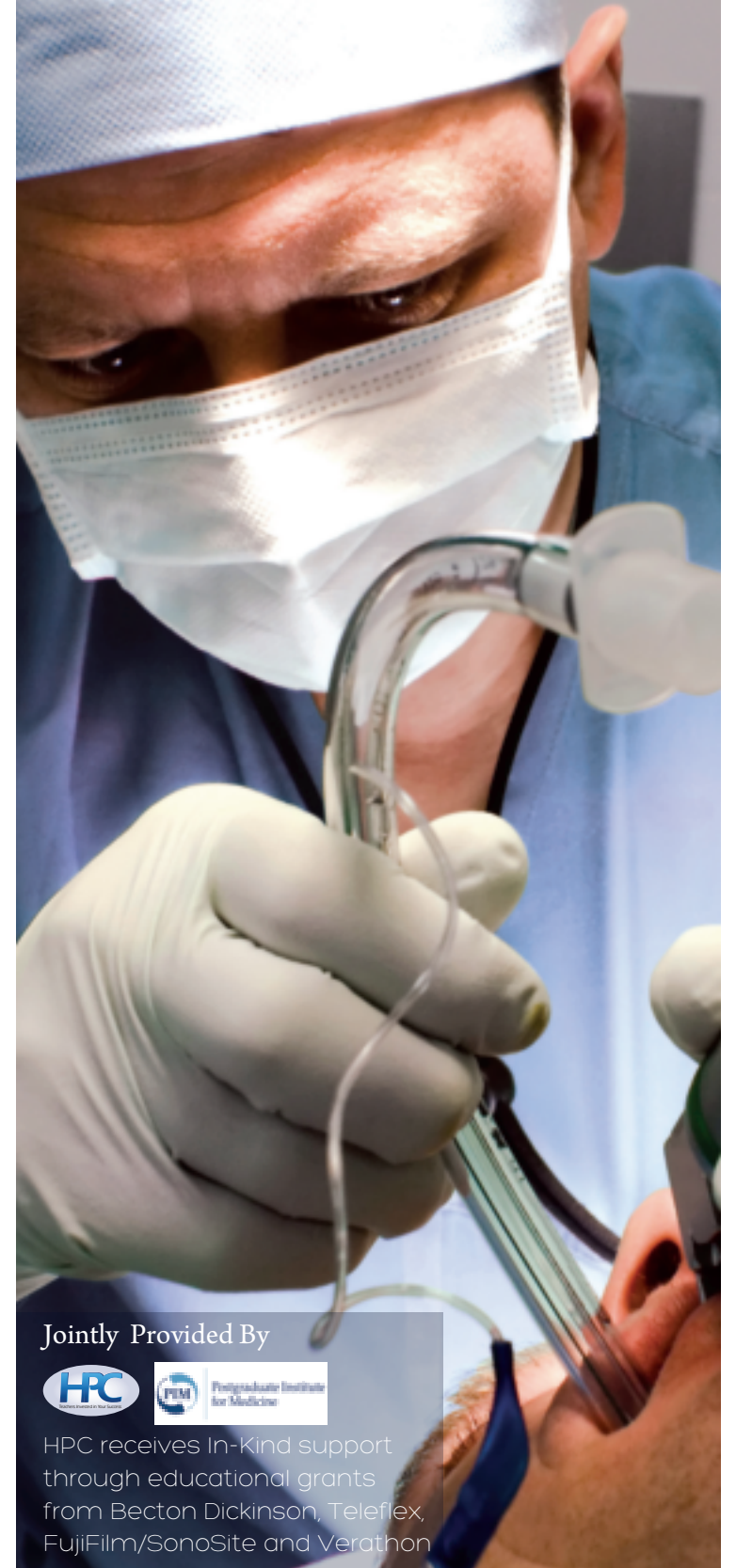

Joseph Esherick, M.D., FAAFP, FHM

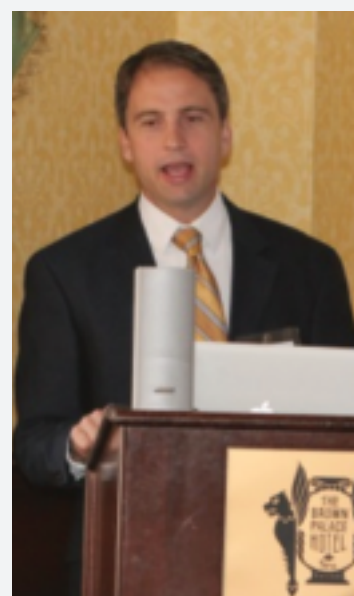
